THE 2014 NORTHSIDE-HESTER PARK HISTORIC GHOST TOUR

Want to learn the spooky side of our neighborhood?

The Northside-Hester Park Neighborhood is hosting a ghost tour Oct. 25. The walking tours will feature ghost stories and neighborhood history. The tours start at 4:30 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. and period characters will guide the groups.

There will be treats served at rest stops along the 12-block tour. Tickets are \$10 per person and can be purchased by calling 320-296-2530. A limited number of tickets are available.

All proceeds will be used to fund neighborhood activities such as keeping the Hester Park wading pool open in the summer, new amenities at the park and the Neighborhood Proud program.

CITY TO UPDATE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

After some initial delays, the city will update its Comprehensive Plan!

A community open house will be held on Thursday, October 23, from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. This public session will be at Regency Plaza, 912 West Saint Germain Street. The evening begins with a review of the purpose of a Comprehensive Plan and concludes with input.

This single open house is just the beginning of a massive process. Earlier the same day, a meeting will be conducted with representatives of the Saint Cloud Neighborhood Coalition. On Friday, October 24, members of the local business community will discuss issues.

Additional opportunities for input will be offered as this project progresses. The public can stay informed and get involved by visiting the Comprehensive Plan website, www.StCloudPlan.com.

Review of the Comprehensive Plan is of particular interest to the Hester Park neighborhood. In 2013, a survey was conducted of most residences south of Veterans Drive. Many of the houses in this area are zoned "RS," the designation for apartments. Consequently, landlords can easily remodel houses into separate apartments, or replace houses with apartment buildings. The 2013 survey showed interest in downzoning this area to a designation more compatible with existing homes and the surrounding neighborhood.

MULT-GENERATION HOUSE: TO RENT OR FLIP?

Restoration of a century-old house at 715 Fourth Street North is almost complete.

This 1914 structure was home to the Hanson family, then the Monarski family. When Kay Monarski married Don Waldorf, it became known as the Waldorf home. However, in 2007, Don and Kay sold their meticulously maintained home.

In the subsequent seven years, the massive house fell into decay. The shingles and siding were crumbling. The porch and garage sagging. Hope sprang with a new buyer in 2014, Jannew Properities, LLC.



GORECKI GUEST HOUSE PLANS EXPANSION TO WELCOME MORE GUESTS

A generous gift by Benedict and Dorothy Gorecki of Milaca paves the way to begin the process of expanding the St. Cloud Hospital Gorecki

Guest House. The Gorecki Guest House will increase its guest rooms from 12 to 28 to be able to serve more families.

The building footprint only will grow roughly by a third, with the existing square footage of 8,760, adding another 2,850.

CentraCare Health Facility Director, David Larson, is working with local architects to design the addition to complement the existing building as well as fit in well with the neighborhood.

Several neighborhood meetings inviting input from nearby neighbors have taken place.

"We feel strongly about being a good neighbor and will do our best to create a home that is as pleasing on the outside as it is comforting to our guests on the inside," said Larson.

"This addition really is about being able to help more families in need," said Sally Allen, manager of the Guest House. "It is heartbreaking having to turn away people who already are in a very vulnerable position."

BENEFITS OF EXPANSION:

- Serve more families in need, and have the ability to accommodate families immediately upon request.
- Extend registration hours to accommodate families who arrive later in the evening.

ABOUT THE GUEST HOUSE:

Conveniently located across the street from the St. Cloud Hospital, the Gorecki Guest House welcomes patients and family members who are receiving medical care in the St. Cloud community. The house offers a comfortable, homelike atmosphere that allows families the opportunity to stay close to their loved ones.

Since opening on June 15, 2009, the Gorecki Guest House has served more than 9,600 guests from 84 counties in Minnesota, 45 states, and as far away as Canada, England, France, Kenya, and Spain. The Guest House averaged 85 percent occupancy in fiscal year 2014. The house has experienced one out of every two nights at 100 percent occupancy, having to turn away as many as 15 families per night.


